REPORT FROM ORIGIN 2021

■ Orang Utan Coffee - Adapting to a New Normal

20/21 has been a year of unprecedented challenges. The covid-19 pandemic has affected the whole supply chain of the coffee. Restrictions are limiting the movement from picking the ripen cherries to lack of transport. Orang Utan Coffee is trying to take advantage of the pandemic moment, by assisting the farmers to perform good organic cultivation practices for example: rejuvenating plants, replacing old/unproductive plants, improving the land, and adding shade-trees to the plantation.

In addition, we have compiled a guide for standard on green coffee beans grading. These standards are then



disseminated to partner farmers and those who are directly involved in the implementation of green coffee grading. These activities will help to improve the quality of coffee and to provide capacity building for the farmers.

Climate change is likely to impact the global area suitable for coffee growing significantly in the long-term. In this case, we at Orang Utan Coffee have developed a strategy to ensure that all aspects of the supply chain at origin always pay attention to sustainable aspects.

Among others, by increasing the capacity of farmers, adding value by product upgrading, such as selective hand-picking, well-monitored post-harvest processing, adopting safety and sustainability standards, along



with ecological cultivation patterns. Moreover fostering the development and adoption of digital technologies increases efficiency and builds resilience.

We have applied blockchain applications to reduce the barriers and costs for farmers to link to existing high-value market channels (e.g. through timely and accurate information), improve traceability and provide reliable and more direct access to markets.

■ Distribution

10 containers of Orang Utan Coffee were distributed in 2021, which equals **192 tons**.

■ New drying system in Pondok Gajah

Back in 2018, OUC in cooperation with ViCAFE ran a crowdfunding campaign, and we were so happy and thankful to our supporters, for having contributed CHF 50.000 in support of post-harvest facilities. Since then, we have been busy utilizing these funds, with facilities for drying, sorting and storing for the local coffee farmer groups of Wih Bersih and Mekar Indah in 2018, for Uning Bertih and Panji Mulia in 2019, and in 2020 for the Pondok Gajah local farmer group, and hopefully many more to come. The coffee can be kept in the farmer's group and it does not have to be used in one of the public service centers for depulping, fermentation, washing and drying processes.

The facilities have been extremely helpful, to make sure Orang Utan Coffee doesn't just do good but also tastes great!!!





■ Coffee gin with Orang Utan Coffee

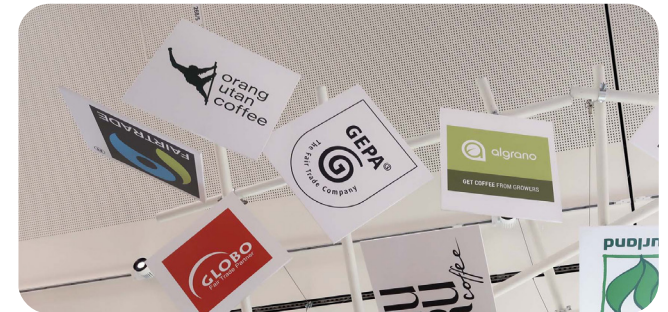
The Kaffeemänner from Saxony-Anhalt have come up with something special. **Experimenting with aromas and products is part of the passion of Kaffeemänner, a coffee gin with roasted Orang Utan Coffee and five other botanicals was created.**

In the search for a suitable producer, they have, after some refuse, found a wonderful partner in the Sächsischen Spirituosenmanufaktur, who have ventured into the project and implemented it excellently. A strong gin, the first taste is juniper and a coffee note in the background, accompanied by coriander, lemon zest, cardamom and rose blossom.

■ Exhibition Cosmos Coffee

This touring exhibition of the Deutsches Museum takes you on a journey into the world of coffee - from the biology of the coffee plant to the chemical and technical processes in production and preparation, the social and economic context of the global coffee trade and the cultural history of coffee drinking. With extraordinary exhibits such as the smallest coffee machine in the world, with real coffee plants, with media stations and interactive elements, it conveys everything that is important to know about small beans. Scents, noises and feel stations make the cosmos of coffee tangible with all the senses and part of it is Orang Utan Coffee.

The „Kosmos Kaffee“ exhibition at the Deutsches Museum opened at **VIDA! from November 22nd 2021 at the Science Center in Brno, Czech Republic.** Before that, it was on view from October 8th 2020 to September 5th 2021 at the State Museum of Natural History, Karlsruhe.



■ Zoom Erlebniswelt Gelsenkirchen

Thanks to our roasting partner Heilandt Kaffeemanufaktur, Orang Utan Coffee is now served in the freshly renovated Café Central directly at the orangutan enclosure of the Zoom Erlebniswelt in Gelsenkirchen.

The new boards explain our Orang Utan Coffee project, where the coffee comes from and show the activities of the Sumatran Orangutan Conservation Programme SOCP, which is supported by every cup of Orang Utan Coffee sold in this Café.



■ OGAWA COFFEE poem donation

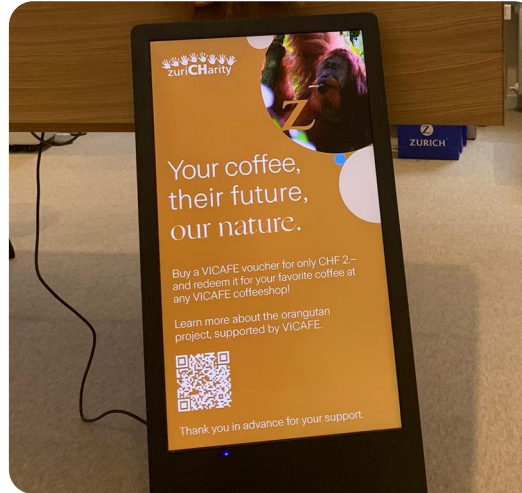

■ Orang Utan Coffee in North America:

With the support of Theta Ridge Coffee, we actively participated in several coffee festival events in the USA in 2021.

Orangutan Coffee is now working with 40 roasters across the country. We are hopeful that more and more coffee drinkers will come to love it and boost the demand.




■ Encapsulated sustainability

Public Coffee Roasters, based in Hamburg, has found a great sustainable capsule solution with a great taste.

They are made of wood fibers, the lid is a filter paper. According to the company's own information, the CO2 consumption during production in Germany is 55 percent lower compared to aluminum capsules. In addition to the Orang Utan Coffee capsules, there are two other types of specialty coffee offered in boxes of 14 pieces. The capsules can be purchased online and in one of the three locations in Hamburg, as well as in some selected shops.

Sumatra lost an average of 214,000 hectares of rainforest per year in the period 2001-2019. The total loss over this time period was 3.9 million hectares.
Today: 14,000 wild orangutans, including Sumatran and Tapanuli species, remain.

Wih Bersih

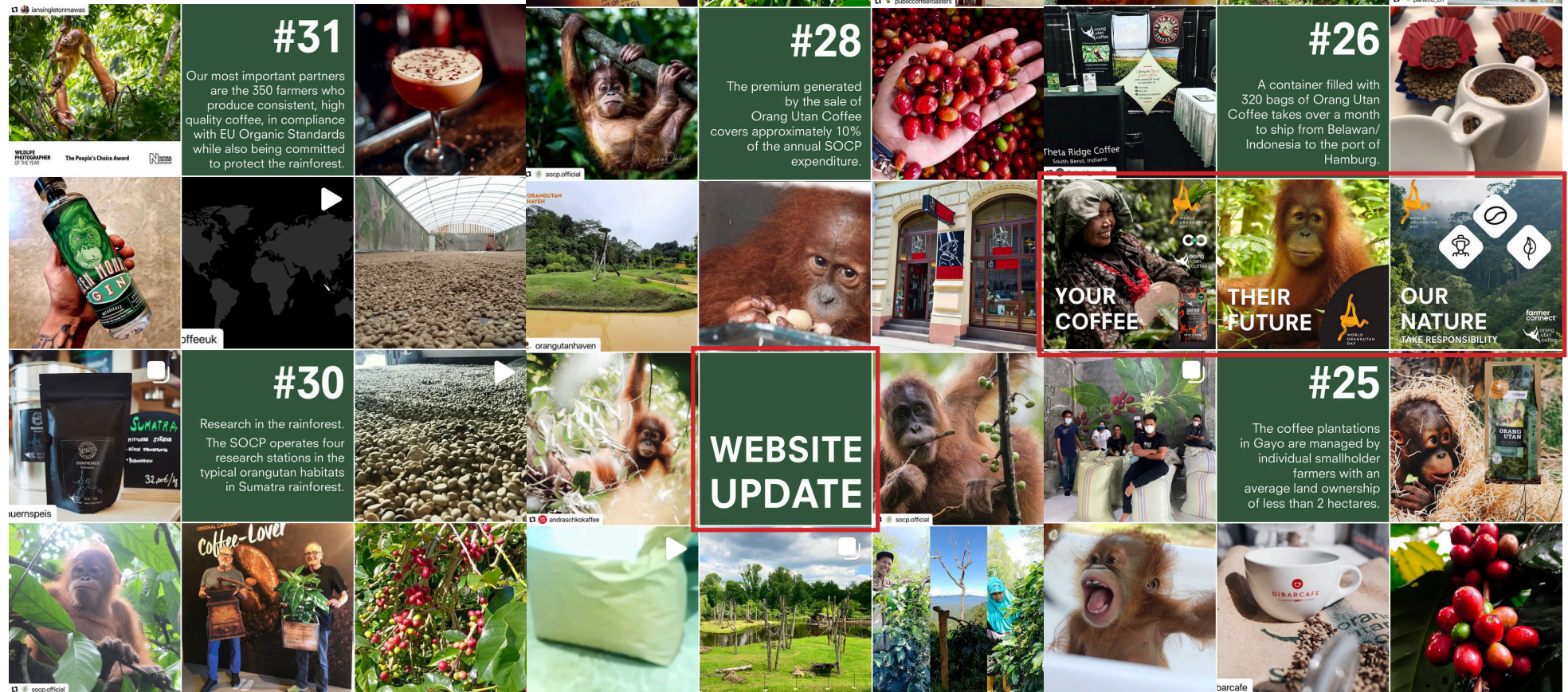
The coffee farmers from Wih Bersih, **our first partners, joined us in 2012**. Since that time, the number of farmers who supply us with coffee has increased from 40 to 62 in 2021. A total of 47 hectares are cultivated with Arabica coffee, mainly Tim-Tim and Ateng varieties. The leader of the farmers' group is **Mulyadi**, he processes the coffee cherries on his plantation according to the typical local "giling basah" (wet hulling) standard. The first coffee farmers were certified organic according to the Indonesian Standard in April 2014. The idyllic village Wih Bersih is located in the Central Aceh district, about 30 minutes west of Takengon, at an altitude of 1200 – 1500 m a.s.l. in the middle of its coffee plantations on a terrace at the foot of a volcanic slope, which is covered by intact montane rainforest.

"Wih Bersih" means "clean water" and this is guaranteed thanks to the rainforest. The biodiversity in this plantation is high. Along with coffee, the farmers cultivate the legume Lamtoro, and plant a variety of other trees such as avocado, tangerine, nangka, durian, papaya, banana, and cinnamon, providing shade for the coffee trees.

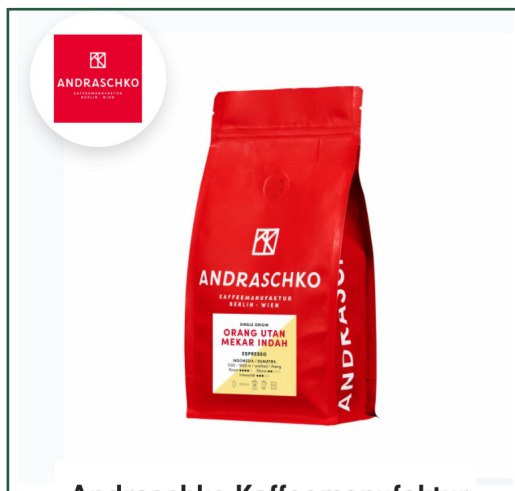

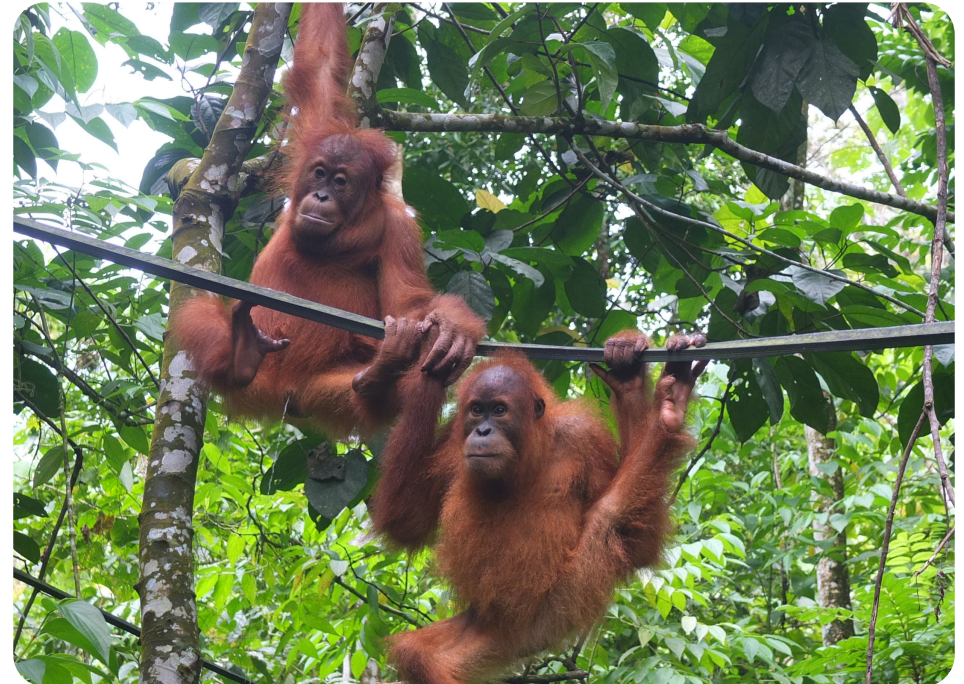
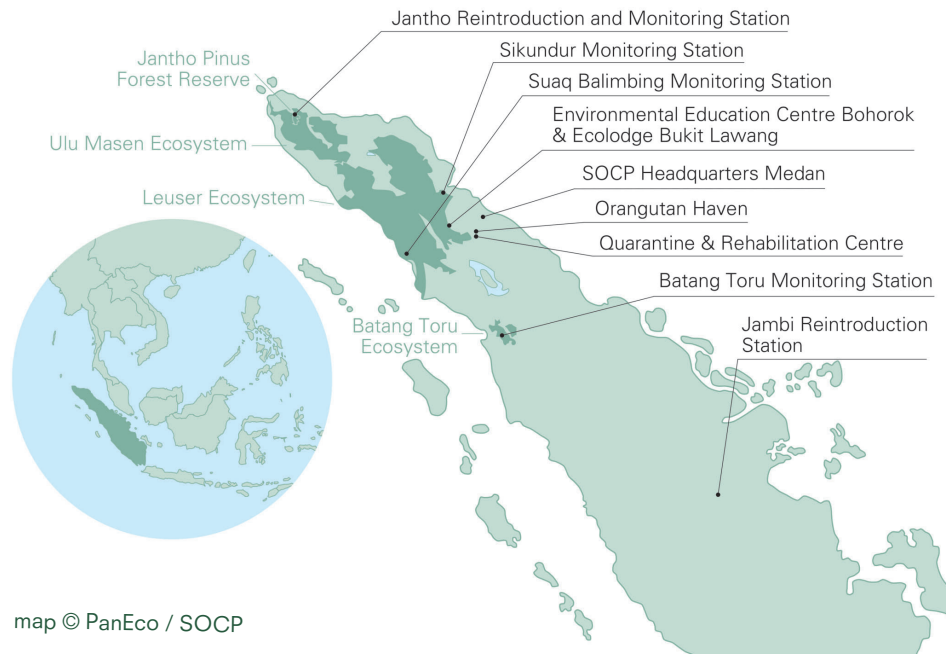
Learn about the highlights of the Sumatran Orangutan Conservation Programme SOCP, which has been supported by OUC with a premium of nearly **EUR 100.000** in 2021:

- Total number of orangutans in the SOCP Quarantine and Rehabilitation Center is 64 orangutans. During the pandemic 14 new orangutans arrived before the Indonesian government stopped the admission due to COVID.
- The SOCP started the transferring of orangutans to the Reintroduction Centre again in April 2021
- Since April 2021 the SOCP transferred 6 orangutans to the Reintroduction Centre in Jantho and 19 to the Reintroduction Centre in Jambi.



The team at the SOCP's Monitoring Stations monitored the following number of wild ranging orangutans during 2021:

- Suaq Balimbing - 37 orangutans
- Batang Toru - 9 orangutans
- Sikundur - 11 orangutans



UPDATE

Orang Utan Haven

The „Orangutan Island system“ was completed in 2021. This includes the valley with the 9 orangutan islands and the entire infrastructure, the veterinary clinic, staff canteen, toilet block, security infrastructure and solar power grid.

Furthermore, the construction and establishment of the eco-farming was completed and a small opening party was celebrated a few weeks ago. The open-air eco-farming building is also being used to receive visitor groups and to conduct conservation education activities until further visitor infrastructure is completed. The gardens and seedling nursery grow vegetables and harvest fruit for feeding the orangutans at the Quarantine and Rehabilitation Centre as well as for sale at the market.

The range of environmental education was decisively advanced in 2021 with the support of external experts. An environmental education concept with offers for various target groups and dossiers for teachers and students is currently being finalized. The first test runs with school groups will start shortly. The detailed planning of the entrance area with ticketing office, car park and staff building has been completed.

However, we are optimistic that we will be able to bring the first orangutans to the Haven this summer.
